

There have been some recent changes to the Municipal Code's parking regulations. New parking regulations include all State and Municipal roadways including the easements between streets and sidewalks.

- Personal or commercial property, building materials or construction equipment may not be stored on Municipal property or any public streets, roads, or highways. A temporary storage permit may be available and issued by the Police Department.
- No temporary permits will be issued between May 1 and September 30 for the business historic district except for emergencies and only with approval of the Chief of Police. The business historic district runs from 1st Avenue to 7th Avenue on Broadway Street and includes the side streets off of both sides of Broadway Street
- Operative vehicles are allowed to park on public streets, not signed for timed parking, for no more than 30 days without movement. A one time 30 day extension may be applied for at the Police Department.
- Trailers may not be parked on any street or highway right of way for more than 24 hours at any one time.

The police department is asking that everyone, especially construction companies, carefully review the above information. If you are preparing a construction project, or need to temporarily store equipment on the street in order to start or complete a project all you need to do is either come down or call the police station and a permit can quickly be issued to satisfy your reasonable needs.

If you notice an orange violation sticker on your vehicle, trailer or property, please take care of the violation before the Municipality tows and impounds the property and assesses towing, impound and storage fees.

The fee schedule for hauling, towing and moving property, vehicles, boats and boat trailers, fifth wheels is actual cost to the Municipality. The impound fees are \$100.00 and the storage fees are \$100 per month.
